STATE OF COLORADO

A "yes/for" vote on any ballot question is a vote in favor of changing current law or existing circumstances, and a "no/against" vote on any ballot question is a vote against changing current law or existing circumstances.

Amendment 68 (CONSTITUTIONAL)
SHALL STATE TAXES BE INCREASED \$114,500,000 ANNUALLY IN THE FIRST FULL FISCAL YEAR, AND BY SUCH AMOUNTS THAT ARE RAISED THEREAFTER, BY IMPOSING A NEW TAX ON AUTHORIZED HORSE RACETRACKS' ADJUSTED GROSS PROCEEDS FROM LIMITED GAMING TO INCREASE STATEWIDE FUNDING FOR K-12 EDUCATION, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, AMENDING THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION TO PERMIT LIMITED GAMING IN ADDITION TO PRE-EXISTING PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING AT ONE QUALIFIED HORSE RACETRACK IN EACH OF THE COUNTIES OF ARAPAHOE, MESA, AND PUEBLO; AUTHORIZING HOST COMMUNITIES TO IMPOSE IMPACT FEES ON HORSE RACETRACKS AUTHORIZED TO CONDUCT LIMITED GAMING; ALLOWING ALL RESULTING REVENUE TO BE COLLECTED AND SPENT NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LIMITATIONS PROVIDED BY LAW; AND ALLOCATING THE RESULTING TAX REVENUES TO A FUND TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND THE CHARTER SCHOOL INSTITUTE FOR K-12 EDUCATION?

Proposition 104 (STATUTORY)
Shall there be a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes requiring any meeting of a board of education, or any meeting between any representative of a school district and any representative of employees, at which a collective bargaining agreement is discussed to be open to the public?

Proposition 105 (STATUTORY)
Shall there be a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes concerning labeling of genetically modified food; and, in connection therewith, requiring food that has been genetically modified or treated with genetically modified material to be labeled, "Produced With Genetic Engineering" starting on July 1, 2016; exempting some foods including but not limited to food from animals that are not genetically modified but have been fed or injected with genetically modified food or drugs, certain food that is not packaged for retail sale and is intended for immediate human consumption, alcoholic beverages, food for animals, and medically prescribed food; requiring the Colorado department of public health and environment to regulate the labeling of genetically modified food; and specifying that no private right of action is created for failure to conform to the labeling requirements?

TOWN OF CRESTED BUTTE

BALLOT QUESTION 2D
SHALL THE TOWN OF CRESTED BUTTE TAXES BE INCREASED BY UP TO FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$400,000.00) IN THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 2015 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2015, AND BY WHATEVER ADDITIONAL AMOUNTS ARE RAISED ANNUALLY THEREAFTER, BY IMPOSING AN INCREASE TO THE TOWN'S SALES TAX AND USE TAX RATES BY 0.5% (I.E., FROM 4.0% TO 4.5%), WITH SAID INCREASE IN SALES TAXES TO PROVIDE REVENUE FOR PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITY MAINTENANCE AND PARKS AND RECREATION CAPITAL AND PROGRAMS AND SAID INCREASE IN USE TAX TO BE APPLIED AS IT ALWAYS HAS BEEN UNDER THE CRESTED BUTTE MUNICIPAL CODE; AND SHALL THE TOWN BE AUTHORIZED TO COLLECT, RETAIN AND SPEND SUCH REVENUE AS A VOTER APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE UNDER ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION OR ANY OTHER LAW?

BALLOT QUESTION 3B
SHALL GUNNISON WATERSHED SCHOOL DISTRICT RE-1J'S TAXES BE INCREASED \$2,500,000 ANNUALLY, OR SUCH LESSER AMOUNT AS THE BOARD OF EDUCATION MAY ANNUALLY DETERMINE, BY THE COLLECTION OF ADDITIONAL AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE 2014-2015 BUDGET YEAR AND EACH SUCCESSIVE BUDGET YEAR THEREAFTER, FOR DEPOSIT IN THE DISTRICT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO:

- * MAINTAINING EXISTING CLASS SIZES;
- * RESTORING MATH INTERVENTION, COUNSELLING, LIBRARY MEDIA TECHNOLOGY, SPECIAL EDUCATION AND OTHER CRITICAL STUDENT PROGRAMS AND SERVICES THAT WERE CUT DUE TO REDUCTIONS IN STATE FUNDING;
- * REINSTATING VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE STUDENTS HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE AND ALLOW THEM TO GAIN PRACTICAL SKILLS FOR FUTURE JOBS;
- * RESTORING AND MAINTAINING RIGOROUS SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATH PROGRAMS FOCUSED ON PREPARING STUDENTS FOR COLLEGE AND THE WORKPLACE;
- * STRENGTHENING THE DISTRICT'S FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM;
- * RESTORING ART, MUSIC, AND FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAMMING;
- * REINSTATING THE DISTRICT'S BUS REPLACEMENT PROGRAM TO MAINTAIN SERVICES AND STUDENT SAFETY;
- * EXTENDING THE USEFUL LIFE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES BY RESTORING MAINTENANCE SCHEDULES AND ACTIVITIES CUT DUE TO REDUCTIONS IN STATE FUNDING;

WITH SUCH TAXES TO BE IN EXCESS OF PROPERTY TAX REVENUES THAT WOULD BE PROVIDED BY THE GENERAL FUND MILL LEVY PERMITTED UNDER STATE LAW WITHOUT SUCH INCREASE AND, TOGETHER WITH REVENUES FROM SPECIFIC OWNERSHIP TAXES ATTRIBUTABLE THERETO AND THE EARNINGS ON SUCH TAXES AND REVENUES, TO CONSTITUTE VOTER APPROVED REVENUE AND SPENDING CHANGES UNDER, TO BE COLLECTED AND SPENT EACH YEAR WITHOUT LIMITATION BY THE REVENUE AND SPENDING LIMITS OF, AND WITHOUT AFFECTING THE DISTRICT'S ABILITY TO COLLECT AND SPEND OTHER REVENUES OR FUNDS UNDER, ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION OR ANY OTHER LAW?

BALLOT QUESTION 4A
SHALL THE GUNNISON COUNTY METROPOLITAN RECREATION DISTRICT TAXES BE INCREASED \$57,060 (\$136 FOR SAGUACHE COUNTY, \$56,924 FOR GUNNISON COUNTY) IN 2015 (THE FIRST FISCAL YEAR) AND BY WHATEVER AMOUNTS MAY BE GENERATED ANNUALLY THEREAFTER BY AN IMPOSITION OF AN ADDITIONAL MILL LEVY OF NOT TO EXCEED 0.127 MILLS. FOR A NEW TOTAL MILL LEVY OF NOT MORE THAN 1.0 MILL UPON TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE DISTRICT, COMMENCING WITH TAXES COLLECTED IN 2015 FOR TAXES DUE FOR 2014, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE OPERATING EXPENSES OF THE DISTRICT AND/OR OTHER LAWFUL DISTRICT PURPOSES AND SHALL THE DISTRICT BE AUTHORIZED TO COLLECT AND RETAIN AND SPEND ALL REVENUES FROM ITS PROPERTY TAXES AND THE EARNINGS FROM THE INVESTMENT OF SUCH REVENUES AS A VOTER APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE AND AN EXCEPTION TO THE LIMITS WHICH WOULD OTHERWISE APPLY UNDER ARTICLE X SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION OR SECTION 29-1-301 COLORADO REVISED STATUTES OR ANY OTHER LAW AND WITHOUT LIMITING IN ANY YEAR THE AMOUNT OF OTHER REVENUES THAT MAY BE COLLECTED AND SPENT BY THE DISTRICT?
